800 Acts of Kindness

As part of the various activities being carried out to celebrate 800 years of Christianity in Solihull, Messy Church back in March focussed on the 800 Acts of Kindness project.

One family has shared with us how they responded to the challenge. Alivia made a promise to make a card for someone and to feed the birds. She fulfilled these promises during lockdown along with her sister Ivy. They made bird feeders and hung them around the park.

They made VE Day cards and presents that they delivered to elderly relatives and to the teachers at school but it didn't stop there.....They also made bug hotels for minibeasts to live in and planted flowers to deliver to their relatives for Easter.

Alivia worked hard with Daddy to make a habitat for butterflies to live in in their garden. Alivia also decided that she would use their daily walks as an opportunity to help nature and set herself the challenge of walking 200 miles to raise money for the RSPB. She completed her challenge over a two month period and was very proud to raise £170. Wow what an amazing achievement!
