BIBLE READINGS Genesis 9. 8-17

God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.'

NEW TESTAMENT 1 Peter 3. 18-end

Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

GOSPEL Mark 1. 9-15

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

Community Champions News 18.02.21 Figures

Cases in Solihull are down 15% to 205.7 per 100,000, and down 32% to 135 per 100,000 for the 60+ age group. The equivalent figures for the West Midlands were both down by 30%. This is a steady and slow reduction, but rates are still high. 8.8% of tests are positive. ITU cases are still very high and we do not want to put any more pressure on hospitals. Transmission is still thought to be from workplaces back to households.

Vaccinations

Invitations are now going out to the 60+ age group and the clinically vulnerable. 2127 extra people in Solihull have been identified as clinically vulnerable; they are likely to be contacted in the next week.

If you are not in either of these groups, be wary of invitations to be vaccinated that are not from your GP. Some people have arrived at mass vaccination centres and have been turned away.

There have been excellent reports from Monkspath this week; the queues have been sorted. The key message is: do not let down your guard. Remember Hands – Face – Space and comply with the regulations.

Employment

If you receive a letter telling you to shield, you are protected from an employment point of view under equality legislation.; changes to contracts are classed as discrimination against a disability.

Domestic abuse

We heard from Caroline Murray. The restrictions of Covid have provided prime conditions in which domestic abuse has increased.

Domestic abuse is defined as: controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse. It is the worldwide leading cause of morbidity in 19-44 year old women. It constitutes 32% of all violent crime reported to West Midlands Police, yet only 35% of abuse is reported. In Solihull, 4846 women per year report being abused.

From April 2021, children who witness or experience abuse will be treated as victims.

#noexcuseforabuse is the regional campaign to raise awareness.
