

The Greeting

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

All and also with you.

Words of welcome or introduction.

Call to worship

Take up the whole armour of God.

Fasten the belt of truth about your waist.

and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God. (Ephesians 6.13-17)

The Confession

St George was brave! He stood up for Jesus and for what was right; he risked his life fighting the dragon and setting people free from fear; he died for Jesus and for his Christian friends.

Let us take a few moments to remember the times we have not been brave and confess them.

Short silence.

Dear God, We are not as brave as we would like to be.

We remember the times when we have run away, or got angry or panicky, or turned our back when you wanted us to speak the truth and hold firm.

We know you love us and want us to be our best selves, so we ask you to wipe out those times and to fill us with your peace.

Help us to know that you are always at our side so that we don't need to be afraid.

Show us how to overcome evil with good, like Jesus did, and like St George.

Please sit

We thank you, loving Father, because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son.
He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live.
Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us Christ's body and his blood.

2nd Young Person Why do we share this bread and wine? **All** Listen, and we will hear.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.' After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.
