

On a Friday, he was crucified, dead and buried, but on Sunday he rose to life again. We believe he will come again in glory and that his kingdom will have no end. What a lot we have to celebrate today.

THE TALK

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Please stand

As we celebrate again the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ we remember that through these saving acts we have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we might rise with him to a new life within the family of his Church. We now have opportunity to renew the promises made at our baptism, to affirm our allegiance to Christ and our rejection of all that is evil.

The celebrant says

Do you renew and affirm the promises made when you were baptized?

I do.

Do you turn in faith to Christ?

I do.

Do you then renounce all evil?

I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, creator of heaven and earth? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ, who redeemed the world? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit who gives life to the people of God? I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The celebrant continues

Those who are baptized are called to worship and serve God.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? With the help of God, I will.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people, loving your neighbour as yourself? With the help of God, I will.

Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society, by prayer for the world and its leaders, by defending the weak, and by seeking peace and justice? With the help of God, I will.

The celebrant says Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have given us the will to do all these things: Give us the courage and strength to achieve them to the honour and glory of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

May Christ dwell in your hearts through faith, that you may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit. **Amen.**

In baptism, water is a sign of the washing away of our sins and a sign of the new life God gives us through his resurrection. In this bowl, we have water that has been taken from the font. With the help of the children all of us will now be sprinkled with it to wash us clean and remind us of our baptism.
