The President introduces the service.

Today is a great day of celebration! Today, *Nathaniel, Victor, Ethan, and Ivy* will receive our risen Lord Jesus Christ for the first time in bread and wine. They have been preparing with the encouragement of their families by learning a deeper understanding of what we do when we meet together for the breaking of bread. We welcome them with their families and supporters and look forward to admitting them later in the service.

In baptism we died with Christ, so that as Christ was raised from the dead, we might walk in newness of life.

Let us receive new life in him as we confess our sins in penitence and faith.

We keep a moment of stillness.

Invite everyone to curl their hands into a ball.

Forgive us for holding things too tightly and forgetting to share.

THE TALK

The President invites the candidates to stand and addresses them:

Since it is through Baptism alone that we have access to the Lord's Table,
I invite you to come to the font
where you will make the sign of the cross on your forehead
with the blessed water of baptism
as a reminder of your Baptism
by which you became a member of the worldwide Christian family, the Church.

The candidates walk to the font, following the processional cross. Close family members and any Godparents are invited to follow. We all stand and turn to face the font.

WE BELIEVE Please stand

Let us all stand and affirm, our common faith in Jesus Christ – responding, 'I believe and trust in God.'

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

All I believe and trust in God.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

All I believe and trust in God.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

All I believe and trust in God.

This is the faith of the Church.

All This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The candidates are invited to dip their fingers in the water of the font

and make the sign of the cross on their foreheads;

President

As we prepare to invite these young people to the Eucharist, I invite them to walk from the font, the place of baptism, to gather in front of the altar, where we will share the Lord's Supper. Candidates will face the congregation, with parents, siblings, and godparents standing behind.

WELCOME TO FIRST COMMUNICANTS

Brothers and sisters, today we are welcoming these young people to Holy Communion. Some time ago, all these children were baptized and became members of the Body of Christ.

As parents and godparents, and as the community of Solihull Parish, we share the responsibility of encouraging them in their worship and learning, and of supporting them by our friendship, our example and our prayers.

Will you help them to grow in faith and love?

The President addresses all the candidates by name: (Nathaniel, Ethan, Victor, Ivy).

You love God, you follow Jesus, and you live the Christian life. Do you wish to receive Holy Communion?

Candidates: We do

Addressing the congregation, the president asks:

People of God, these young people are members of our Christian family. On behalf of the whole people of God, I ask: are you ready to welcome them with joy as communicant members of the Church?

All In the Lord's name we welcome them.

In the name of our Bishops, Michael and Esther, I admit you to the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. May God bless you as you continue with us on the pilgrim journey of faith.

PRESENTATION OF CROSSES

As a sign of our welcome and as a reminder of this happy day we give to each of you a cross, a reminder that you need never feel alone. We pray that as you look upon the cross of Jesus you will come to know how much the Lord loves you. We ask you to accept this gift with our love and as a sign of our welcome and fellowship in the name of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The community expresses its joy and welcome with applause as the crosses are distributed.

President:

As all these young people receive today the sacrament of the body and blood of Christ, let us pray that we may all know and reflect the love of Christ.

Loving God, we pray for *Ethan, Ivy, Nathaniel and Victor* and ask that they may know you are with them every day, and that your presence is with them in every situation. Help them to be confident to share in your life and courageous in sharing that life with others.

All Amen.

Loving God, as we give thanks for these young people and this step that they are taking today, help each of us to walk with you, to know the presence of your Spirit within and beside us, that together we might grow in holiness, ready to be sent into the world, to love and serve in Jesus' name.

All Amen.

Finally, a prayer for Christian Aid as we begin Christian Aid week.

Loving God, we give thanks for the work of Christian Aid and for all who dedicate their lives to serving others. We thank you for the opportunity to participate in this work through our giving, becoming part of a global community of love and compassion. May our actions be a reflection of your love and your grace.
