**BIBLE STORY** (from My Big Story Bible by Tom Wright): Genesis 11

After the flood, Noah's children and grandchildren started to look for new places to live. But they didn't want to be scattered ever the earth. They wanted to be together in one place.

"Hey! Why don't we build a big city?" they said. "And in the middle let's build a giant tower!" So that's what they did. They thought their tower would reach all the way from earth to heaven. They thought they were very clever.

God came down to have a look. He saw how proud the people were of their tower. He saw how they wanted to do everything without him. That made him sad.

God decided something had to change. In those days, the world had just one language, so instead of allowing everyone to speak the same language, God made them speak lots of different ones.

When that happened, the people building the tower didn't feel so clever. They tried to talk to one another, but it was no good. Some tried shouting orders. They shouted and shouted, and waved their arms about, but nobody could understand them! In the end they threw down their tools and gave up.

The people left the tower half-finished and wandered off to look for other places to live. So they ended up scattered over the earth after all.

The place where they tried to build the tower was called Babel, because of the babble made by all the languages.

#### BIBLE READING: Colossians 1.15-28

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers - all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled<sup>1</sup> in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him - provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

#### GOSPEL: Luke 10.38-end

Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.' But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'
