BIBLE STORY (from My Big Story Bible by Tom Wright): Genesis 28-32

Jacob ran. He knew he had to leave, but where could he go? He decided he would look for Laban, his uncle who lived in Horan, and tell him what had happened.

It was a long journey. one night, he was so tired that he went to sleep with a stone for his pillow. As he slept, God sent him a dream. In the dream he saw a stairway that stretched from earth to heaven. Angels were walking up and down on it. And there, standing at the top, was God. "I am with you," said God. "This land is for you and your children, and you will be a blessing to the whole world." When Jacob woke up, he said to himself, "This place must be the House of God!"

At last Jacob arrived in Haran, where he found Laban and the rest of Abraham's family. Jacob stayed with them for seven years, working on Laban's farm. During that time, Jacob fell in love with Laban's younger daughter, Rachel, and he asked to marry her. But Laban tricked Jacob and gave him his elder daughter, Leah, instead. Laban then promised to give him Rachel as well, if Jacob promised to work for him for another seven years.

After those seven years had gone by, Jacob decided to make the long journey back to Canaan. He gathered his two wives, his large family, and all their belongings, and they set off. One night, something very strange happened. Jacob was alone outside, when suddenly he met a stranger who challenged him to a wrestling match! All through the night they wrestled, and in the morning Jacob realized that the stranger was an angel. The angel gave him God's blessing. "You know, Jacob," he said, "you should really be called 'Israel'." The name Israel means "fighter of God".

BIBLE READING Hebrews 13.1-8, 15-16

Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Let marriage be held in honour by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have; for he has said, 'I will never leave you or forsake you.' So we can say with confidence,

'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?'

Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

GOSPEL: Luke 14.1, 7-14

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, "Give this person your place", and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher"; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.'

He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

O God, you declare your almighty power most chiefly in showing mercy and pity: mercifully grant to us such a measure of your grace, that we, running the way of your commandments, may receive your gracious promises, and be made partakers of your heavenly treasure. through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
